## PREPARATORY ACTION IN THE FIELD OF SPORT 2010

On 22 May 2010, a call for proposals to implement the 2010 Preparatory Action in the field of sport (EAC/22/2010) was published in the Official Journal of the European Union.

The main objective of the Preparatory actions in the field of sport is to prepare future EU actions in this field, on the basis of priorities set in the White Paper on Sport.

This call for proposals will support transnational projects proposed by public bodies or civil society organisations in order to identify and test suitable networks and good practices in the field of sport, in the following areas:

- Fight against doping
- Promoting social inclusion in and through sport
- Promoting volunteering in sport

The budget available for this call for proposals is EUR 2 500 000. EU co-financing will be provided to a maximum of 80% of the total eligible costs.

Projects must start between 1 December 2010 and 31 March 2011 and end no later than 30 June 2012. The deadline for submission of applications to the European Commission is **31 August 2010**

## EU SPORT FORUM 2010 – REPORT NOW AVAILABLE

The second EU Sport Forum since the adoption of the EU White Paper on Sport took place in Madrid on 19 and 20 April 2010. The Commission's report from the Forum is now available and available in [clicking here](#).

As foreseen in the 2007 White Paper on Sport, the EU Sport Forum is a key annual event organised by the European Commission in the framework of the structured dialogue on sport at EU level. This year's event provided valuable input for the Commission's consultations with stakeholders on the implementation of the sport provisions of the Lisbon Treaty, which entered into force in December 2009.

On the second day of the Forum, co-organised with the Spanish Presidency, a joint panel discussion with EU Sport Ministers took place, prior to their informal meeting which was held in Madrid on 21 April 2010.

The European Commission highlights that an active exchange of views with representatives from a variety of sport and sport-related organisations contributed to ensuring the success of the event in spite of the exceptional circumstances due to the closure of parts of European airspace and has helped the Commission to identify future priorities for its planned initiatives in the field of sport.

## CEDEFOP PUBLICATION - SKILLS SUPPLY & DEMAND IN EU: *Medium-term forecast up to 2020*

Europe must focus more on skills than ever before. Skills to adapt and to shape the jobs of tomorrow are essential for Europe's citizens and businesses to speed up economic recovery.

CEDEFOP'S new skill demand and supply forecast up to 2020 sets the scene for anticipating future trends. The aim of this report is to provide policy-makers, employers, skills providers, employment services and individual learners with better



information to make more informed decisions.

It is evident from the forecast that Europe not only needs to step up investment in education and training, but also encourage employers to use better the skills and talents of their staff.

The forecast suggests that aggregate demand and supply trends across countries are converging in the medium to longer term, but we need to dig deeper to grasp what is really going on. Changing skill needs, job polarisation and skill mismatch interact in complex ways.

## **CEDEFOP CALL FOR TENDER:**

### ***Analysing the Labour Market Outcomes of VET***

Under the reference number AO/RPA/ALSTI-MSERA/Labour Market Outcomes of VET/008/10, on 18 May 2010, CEDEFOP published a call for tender on "Analysing the Labour Market Outcomes of Vocational Education and Training (VET)".

The objective of the contract is to analyse the labour market outcomes of Vocational Education and Training and related patterns in available countries.

This will be based on data from the 2009 EU Labour Force Survey ad hoc module on the entry of young people into the labour market, and combined with variables from the core labour force survey. Key patterns and related policy messages should be included in a series of theme-based reports with descriptive, multivariate and regression analysis based on both aggregated weighted data and microdata.

Deadline for submitting tenders is **02 July 2010**.

## **CALL FOR PROPOSALS EACEA/10/2010 (ECET):**

### ***Support for European cooperation in Education & Training***

Making lifelong learning a reality is a core objective of the Strategic framework for European cooperation in education and training ("ET2020") Member States committed themselves to putting in place coherent and comprehensive national lifelong learning strategies. In this regards the European Commission has published the EACEA/10/2010 Call for proposals to support European cooperation in education and training (ECET).

This Call for proposals is divided in two distinct parts:

- Part A — Raising national awareness of lifelong learning strategies and of European cooperation in education and training
- Part B — Support for transnational cooperation in the development and implementation of national and regional lifelong learning strategies

The objectives of the call for proposals are to support the establishment and implementation of coherent and comprehensive lifelong learning strategies and policies at national, regional and local level, covering and inter-linking all types (formal, non-formal, informal) and levels of learning (pre-school, primary, secondary, tertiary, adult, initial and continuing vocational education and training), including links to other relevant policy sectors (e.g. employment and social inclusion)

The total budget earmarked for the co-financing of projects amounts to EUR 2,8million. Financial contribution from the Agency cannot exceed 75 % of the total eligible costs. The maximum grant per project will be EUR 120 000 for Part A and EUR 350 000 for Part B. The Agency intends to allocate the amount available according to the following indicative proportion: 1/2 for Part A — 1/2 for Part B. However, the final allocation depends on to the number and quality of the proposals received for Parts A and B.

Activities must start between 1 January 2011 and 31 March 2011. The maximum duration of projects is 12 months for Part A and 24 months for Part B.

The deadline for submission of applications to the European Commission is 16 July 2010.

## **ALL FOR SPORT FOR ALL PROJECT:**

### ***Perspective of sport for people with a Disability in Europe***

From 28<sup>th</sup> till 30<sup>th</sup> of April 2010 the Kick-off meeting of the ALL FOR SPORT FOR ALL Project was organised at the headquarters of the [European Paralympic Committee \(EPC\)](#) in Vienna, Austria.

During three intense days of working, the Project Management Group together with all Partners (15 organisations from 12 EU countries), have agreed on the overall



principles, strategies and working methodologies for the project. Major success of the meeting was to agree on the data collection methodology for mapping the status quo of the sector to then being able to contribute to better access to a wide network of opportunities in sport for people with a disability. Data collection will be conducted from June till August 2010 and first results are expected to be presented in October 2010.

The "ALL FOR SPORT FOR ALL: Perspectives of Sport for People with a Disability in Europe" project is conjointly run by the [European Observatoire of Sport and Employment](#) (EOSE) and the [European Paralympic Committee](#) (EPC) from 01<sup>st</sup> of March 2010 till 28<sup>th</sup> of February 2011, and is funded within the Preparatory Action for Sport by the Sport Unit of the European Commission.
